1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing for 2017-2020, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the ISSA Procedural Rules, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions.

2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1. This regatta is a Qualifying Regatta as defined by the NWISA District Supplemental Rules. Qualifying regattas may be attended by active or mixed teams. However, final scores by mixed teams or additional active teams (JV teams) will be removed from the official results and the regatta will be re-scored. For schools sending multiple Active teams, a Varsity team must be designated at registration. This Varsity team will be the team scored in the overall rankings for our Double-handed Fleet Race District Championship.
- 2.2. Current ISSA and NWISA membership is required and will be verified at the time of final registration at the regatta site.
- 2.3. A responsible adult leader must accompany teams at all times
- 2.4. Teams shall be comprised of a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 8 sailors who are full time students in the 9th grade or higher, attending the same high school. Silver fleet is an Open Regatta.
- 2.5. There are no numerical or age restrictions, or school restrictions on junior varsity ("silver fleet") competitors.

3. ENTRY AND COMMUNICATIONS

- 3.1. Registration opens March 6th, 2016 at 11:00am. Eligible schools shall submit their intent to participate, total number of sailors attending and number of boats they can bring to the NWISA registration spreadsheet no later than March 13th, 2016 at 10:00pm. Additional registrations are allowed after this time, but teams may be turned away if boats are unavailable. There will be no morning of registration.
- 3.2. Please add under eligibility that all teams are required to have a \$250 damage deposit on file with NWISA.
- 3.3. A limited number of boat may be available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Teams unable to compete in allocated boats shall notify the Regatta Chair as soon as possible.
- 3.4. Entry fee includes Saturday lunch, Saturday dinner, & Sunday lunch.

Entry Fee: \$18 per person

4. BOATS

- 4.1. Races will be sailed in Flying Junior sailboats (FJs).
- 4.2. All boats will be inspected by the Regatta Chair or designee prior to launching.
- 4.3. Teams should plan to bring additional FJs if possible. Teams are encouraged bring a safety boat if possible.

6. LAUNCHING AND RACING AREAS

- 6.1. The racing area will be Eagle Harbor, Bainbridge Island WA.
- 6.2. FJ launching will take place at [Eagle Harbor Waterfront Park](#), 309 Shannon Dr. SE. The Park is located on the north shore of Eagle Harbor. Trailer parking is on Bjune Drive, near the park.
- 6.3. Racing will take place at [Eagle Harbor Marina](#), 5834 Ward Ave. NE. The marina is located on the south shore of Eagle Harbor.. Parking is at [Pritchard Park](#), near the marina. The marina itself has very limited parking.

7. COURSES

7.1. Based on conditions, the Race Committee will determine the courses. Short collegiate style courses will be used.

8. SCORING

8.1. The regatta will be scored in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules.

9. FORMAT

9.1. The format will consist of two races in A division, followed by boat rotation, and two races in B division.

10. LODGING

10.1. Housing may be available on a limited basis through area families. Please contact Chris Campbell at chris@cpauthority.com no later than Monday March 13. Please indicate if you need housing for Friday and Saturday or Saturday only.

10.2. Sailors must provide their own sleeping bags, pillows, and towels.

10.3. Each team is responsible for supervising their sailors at all times during the regatta and while at provided housing.

11. COACHING

11.1. Team leaders, chaperones, coaches, parents, advisors and other support personnel shall not go afloat in the sailing area from the start of racing Saturday to the end of racing Sunday UNLESS an exception has been explicitly permitted by the regatta chair or PRO.

Competitors may receive coaching including instructions, assistance, equipment or sustenance only while on the designated rotation float or on shore.

12. OFFICIAL NOTICE FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS

12.1. No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, distilled spirits), or use any controlled substance (marijuana, cocaine, etc.), the possession of which is unlawful. An alleged breach of this rule and/or other disciplinary matters that occur may be the basis for a hearing under Rule 69.1. The protest committee for such a hearing will be the Regatta Chairperson, a member of the NWISA Board of Directors and the chairperson of the protest committee.
