

2017 NorCal Divisional Regatta #2

February 11-12, 2017

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

ORGANIZING AUTHORITY: Peninsula Youth Sailing Foundation, Bay Area Youth Sailing, PCISA.

HOST: Peninsula Youth Sailing Foundation

1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined by *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the ISSA Procedural Rules (as modified by PCISA Supplemental Rules), the NorCal Divisional Regattas Notice of Series, the Notice of Race, and by these Sailing Instructions.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices will be posted on the official regatta notice board located at the Peninsula Youth Sailing Foundation (PYSF) classroom, or made orally to all competitors on the water.

3. CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 1000 on the day it will take effect, except that any change in the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 on the day before it will take effect.

4. ROTATION

4.1 Boats will be rotated between races, only within your team. There will be no rotations through the fleet.

4.2 Rotations will be made on F Dock unless otherwise specified at the competitors' meeting.

5. BOATS & SAILS

5.1 All teams will be responsible for rigging and unrigging the boat that they brought, borrowed or chartered for the regatta. Failure to properly care for boats and/or sails may subject a team to protest under this SI.

5.2 Each team must supply their own sails and register the sail number at check-in.

6. COMPETITORS' MEETINGS

MANDATORY Competitors' meetings will be held on Saturday, February 11 and Sunday, February 12 at 1000 adjacent to the Public Boat Ramp.

8. RACING AREA

The Racing Area will be inside the Turning Basin of the Port of Redwood City, with rotations made from F Dock. If the rotation area is changed, it will be stated at the Competitor's Meeting or by Race Committee on the water.

9. THE COURSE

9.1 Diagrams in Attachment A show the courses, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

9.2 The number of the course to be sailed will be hailed and/or displayed from the Race Committee boat.

10. MARKS

Marks of the course will be orange inflatable buoys.

11. START/FINISH

11.1 Races will be started in accordance with RRS Rule Appendix S.

11.2 The start line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee signal boat and a yellow mark on the port

end. The finish line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Race Committee boat and white buoy for the windward finish, or the same line as the starting line for the leeward finish. The start and finish lines will be sighted from the course side of all marks.

11.3 No start signal for a race will be given after 1600 on Sunday, February 12, 2017.

12. INDIVIDUAL RECALL

Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules. The Race Committee will attempt to hail a boat's sail number; however, it is the responsibility of each boat to make a proper start. Failure to be hailed or hear a hail is, in itself, insufficient cause for granting redress. Code Flag 'X' shall be used to signal any recalls.

13. GENERAL RECALLS

A General Recall will be signaled by multiple sound signals. In accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules the "Round-the-Ends" provisions of RRS 30.1 shall then apply to all subsequent starting sequences for that race, without the need for any signal to be given (ISSA PR 7.8 (b)). The three-minute starting sequence signal will begin soon after.

14. RETIREMENT

A boat that retires from a race is asked to notify a Race Committee boat before leaving the race area. If that is impossible, then immediately after arriving ashore, the competitor shall notify a regatta representative.

15. ALTERNATIVE PENALTIES

The two-turns penalty described in RRS Rule 44.2 will apply.

16. PROTESTS

Protests must be filed in writing within 20 minutes after the last boat reaches the dock at the end of the day.

17. SCORING

Scoring will be in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules.

18. BREAKDOWNS

Breakdowns will be in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules.

19. COACHING

19.1 All coaching, crew rotation, exchange of clothing/food/drink and communication shall only occur on land. Coaches are not allowed on the water.

19.2 Spectator boats are discouraged, given the confined racing area and excellent land-based viewing. Any spectator boats must be at anchor at least 100 feet outside the perimeter of the race course to avoid creating wake, and spectators shall have no contact with any competitor except when rendering assistance under RRS Rule 1.1, or as instructed by the Race Committee.

20. PARTICIPATION

20.1 With the exception of RRS Rule 4, each school shall compete in all scheduled races. Any school breaking this rule, without permission of the Race Committee, is subject to severe disciplinary actions by the PCISA.

20.2 Unless competing or serving on or for the Race Committee, no competitor shall be on the water.

21. TROPHIES

Trophies will be awarded to teams placing 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in each Fleet overall, and to the top skipper/crew in each Division.
