- A NATIONAL INVITATIONAL REGATTA FOR FEMALE SAILORS



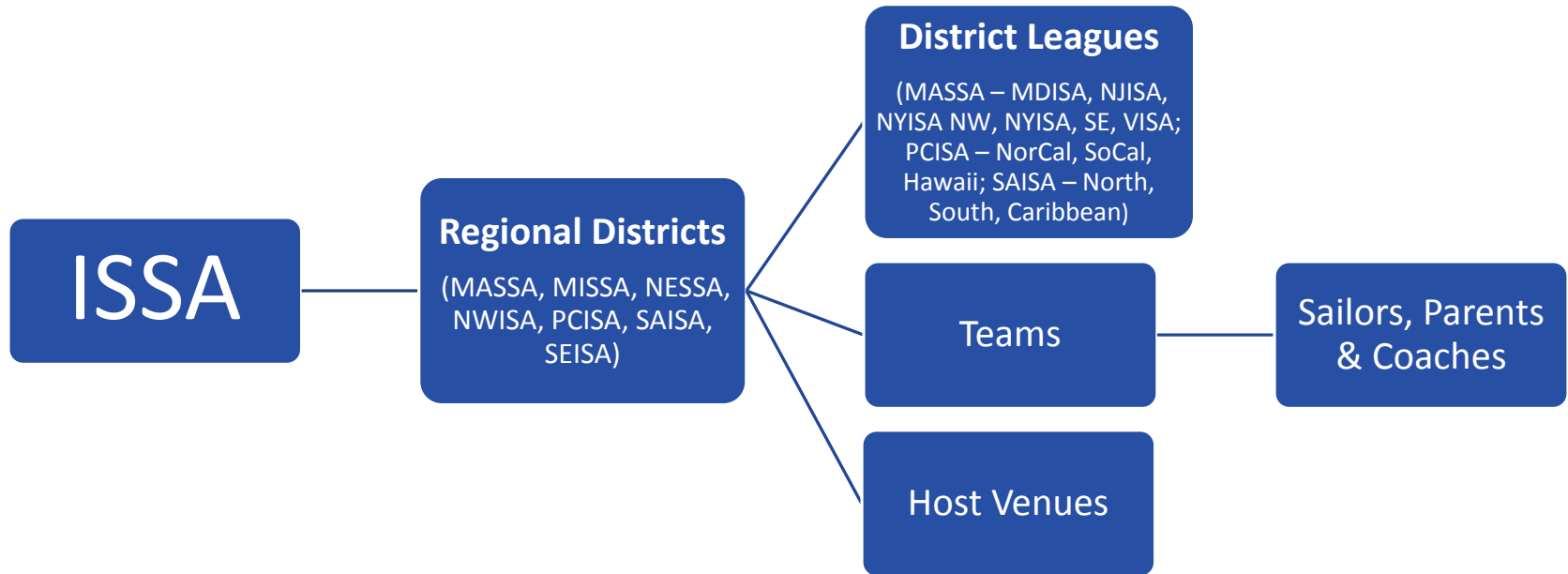

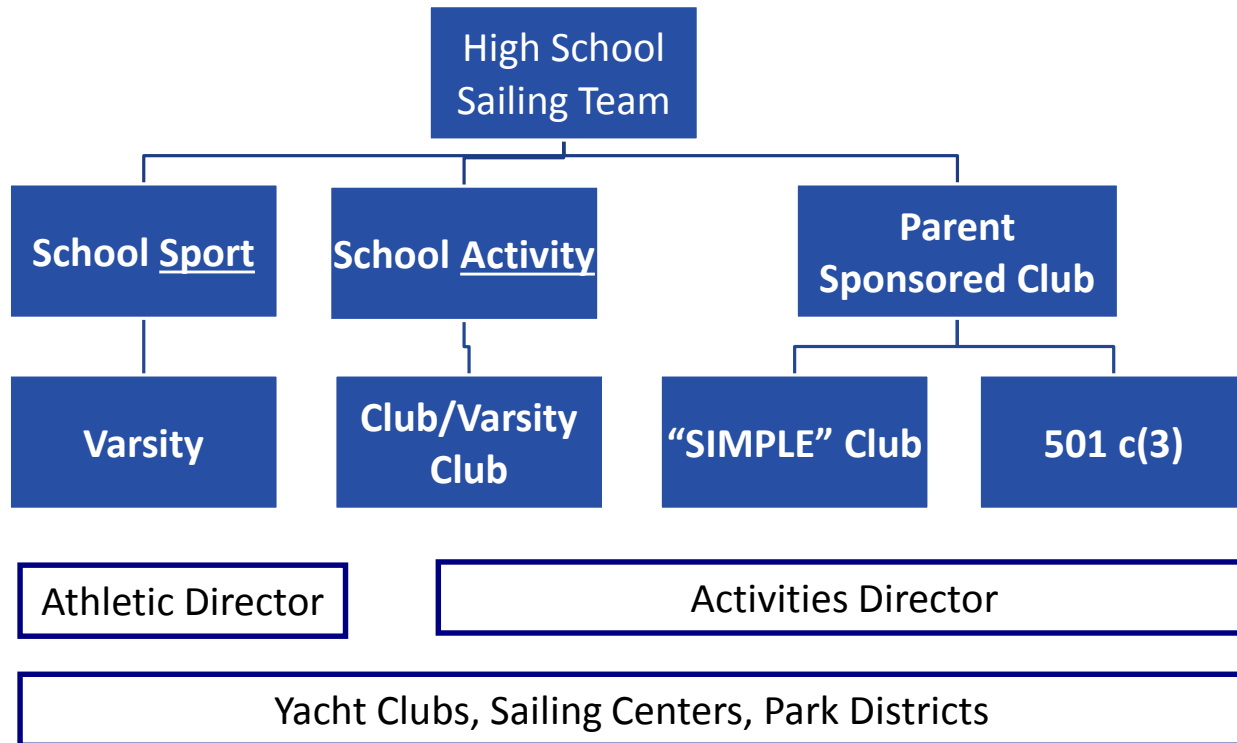

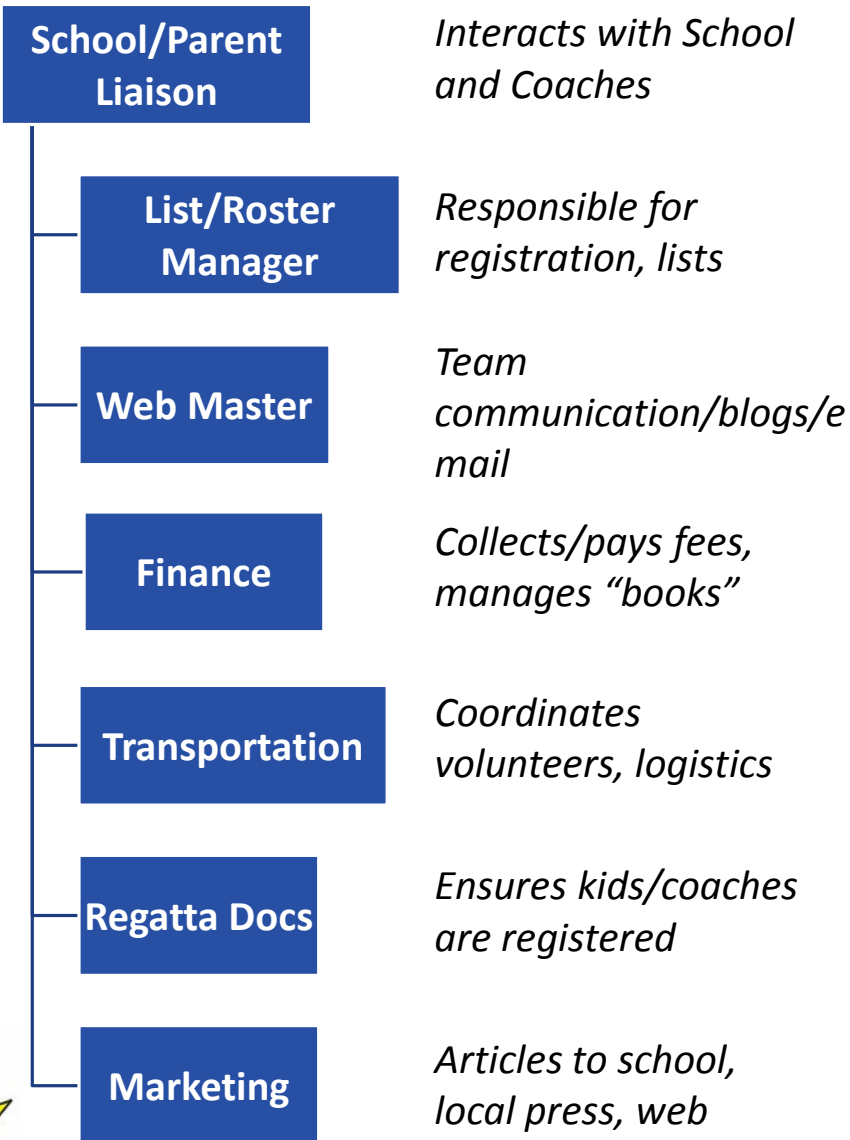
