1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of US Sailing, the ISSA Procedural Rules and MASSA Procedural Rules.
- 1.2 The following RRS optional rules will apply:
 - a) Appendix V1 Penalty at the Time of an Incident, and Appendix V2 Penalty Taken After a Race, will apply.
- 1.3 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) listed below will be changed as follows. The sailing instructions may also change other rules.
 - a) Rule 64.4 (b) is changed to require a hearing before any action is taken.
 - b) Rule 61.1(a) is changed so that “A boat intending to protest about an incident that occurs in the racing area shall notify the Race Committee (RC) finish boat of her intention as soon as possible after finishing, without consultation with instructors, coaches or support persons, including (if possible) the boat identification number of the boat(s) being protested.”

2 ELIGIBILITY, PURPOSE and SUPERVISION

- 2.1 This regatta is open to all boats of the NYISA-SE High School Sailing League that meet MASSA eligibility requirements.
- 2.2 This regatta shall serve as the NYISA-SE League Fleet Race Championship and qualifier for the District Championship hosted in Fort Monroe, NJ on October 20th and 21st.
- 2.3 Teams must be accompanied by a designated adult team leader, who may be an advisor, coach, or parent of at least 18 years of age who is current in CPR/First Aid as well as CDC concussion training in compliance with the NY State Concussion Management and Awareness Act. The designated adult team leader must give his/her name and mobile number during check-in and remain onsite for the duration of the regatta.

3 REGISTRATION and ENTRY FEES

- 3.1 The entry fee is \$150 per team. There is no entry fee to send an instructor.

- 3.2 All entries are due on October 1st with full payment to reserve your spot. Check or credit card will be accepted by mail or over the phone. No refunds of the entry fee will be made.

4 SCHEDULE

- 4.1 Registration: All skippers, crews, and instructors shall appear in person at the registration table during the registration period. Instructors shall also attend the instructors' meeting to receive safety assignments.

- 4.2 The schedule of events is as follows:

- 4.3 No warning signal will be made after 1600 on Saturday, October 6th.

5 MEASUREMENT, SAFETY AND EQUIPMENT

- 5.1 420s provided by WFC will be sailed as provided with no changes allowed to standing rigging.
- 5.2 Alternates may be subbed in, as needed, between races.
- 5.3 Each competitor and instructor/coach shall wear a US Coast Guard approved personal flotation device (PFD) while on the water in accordance with JSA Rule 2.1
- 5.4 Appropriate exposure gear for the prevailing conditions shall be worn by competitors.
- 5.5 All teams must be accompanied by a designated adult team leader, as defined by NOR 2.3.
- 5.6 The RC and Regatta Organizers reserve the right to send anyone to shore with concern for their safety.

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing instructions may be available on line at [<https://bit.ly/2lhnlS>] before the event, no paper copies will be available on the morning of the event.

7 VENUE and SPECTATOR LOCATIONS

- 7.1 The racing area will be the waters North of The WaterFront Center in West Harbor.
- 7.2 Spectators may watch from the bulkhead or pier.
- 7.3 Restrooms are available in the small light blue building two buildings down from WFC.

8 THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be described in the sailing instructions.

9 SCORING

- 9.1 10 races are scheduled. One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 9.2 The Low Point Scoring System, RRS Appendix A shall be use. Noe scores will be excluded. However, RRS A2 is changes by PR 9(a) and 9(b), A8 by PR 11, and A10 by 9(e) and Appendix 3.

10 PERSONAL CONDUCT

- 10.1 All junior sailors, instructors and support persons are expected to behave in accordance with recognized principles of sportsmanship, good manners and fair play. A sailor, instructor or support person may be disciplined as per RRS 64.4 or RRS 69 for violation of this Rule. An alleged breach of this requirement shall not be grounds for a protest. However, when the protest committee believes that a competitor may have breached the above requirement, it shall follow the process described in the JSA Code of Conduct.
- 10.2 If an instructor is asked to leave a race course, all sailors for whom that instructor is responsible shall leave the race course as well unless other satisfactory supervisory arrangements are made.

11 OFFICIAL NOTICE

- 11.1 Competitors' attention is drawn to ISSA Procedural Rule 5.1, which prohibits the use of all alcoholic beverages and controlled substances for the duration of the regatta and sets forth severe penalties for such use.
- 11.2 Competitors, parents and coaches shall comply with any reasonable request from any regatta official including attendance at official functions. Breaches of this SI may be referred to the PC. Any penalty imposed will be at the discretion of the PC. Penalties imposed for breaches by coaches or parents will be imposed against the team with whom the coach or parent is associated.

12 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
