1. **RULES:** The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the ISSA Procedural Rules, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions.

2. **ELIGIBILITY:** Competing schools must be members of ISSA and meet ISSA eligibility rules as prescribed in the Procedural Rules. 18 berths are available and allocated accordingly between NYISA-SE (8) and NJISA (10) teams by their respective MASSA League Directors.

A designated adult team leader, who may be an advisor, coach or parent recognized by the school, must accompany teams.

Sailors shall wear a team pinnie identifying and representing their school per ISSA PR 2.4

3. **ENTRY AND COMMUNICATIONS:** Qualifying schools shall register through their league director by Friday, March 24. Teams unable to compete must notify their league director no later than Thursday, March 30 at 5 p.m. to withdraw.

4. **ENTRY FEE:** No Entry Fee

5. **BOATS:** 18 collegiate 420's provided by SUNY Maritime College. Boats will be sailed as provided.

6. **SCHEDULE**

**Saturday**

**0845-**Check in/registration/rigging of boats

**0915-** Skipper's meeting

**1000-**First warning and schedule for the day

Changes to the schedule will be posted on the official notice board at the location designated at the skippers meeting.

***There is no afternoon cutoff time for racing.***

7. **RACING AREA:** All races will be sailed in the East River in front of the SUNY Maritime waterfront facilities.

8. **COURSES:** Based on conditions, the Race Committee will determine the courses as prescribed in ISSA PR 7.7. W4 Course is the preferred course that will be used.

9. **SCORING:** The regatta will be scored in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules. Scores will be posted on TechScore at <http://scores.hssailing.org>

10. **COACHING:** Team leaders, chaperones, coaches, parents, advisors and other support personnel shall not go afloat in the sailing area unless explicitly permitted by the regatta chairperson. The penalty for failing to comply with this requirement may be the disqualification of all boats, competitors and teams associated with the infringing support personnel.

11. **OFFICIAL NOTICES:** No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, or distilled spirits, each as defined in Chap 51 of the US Internal Revenue Code and intended for beverage use), or marijuana, cocaine, or any other controlled substance (as defined in 21 US Code 802), the possession of which, by that contestant is unlawful under 21 US Code 841. Infringements of this regulation and/or other discipline expectations occurring during the scheduled regatta date may be the basis for a hearing under RRS 69.1 The protest committee for such a hearing shall be the regatta chairperson, a member of the ISSA BOD, and the protest committee chairperson. This protest committee shall, at a time and place selected by them, meet to hear said protest, and their decision to impose scoring penalties, or other sanctions they alone deem appropriate, including summary removal from the regatta, shall be final, without appeal.
