Notice of Race (NOR)

1 RULES

- **1.1** The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The ISSA Procedural Rules 2021-2024 available at https://hssailing.org/documents/ISSA-PR-2021-2024.pdf apply.
- 1.3 The MISSA Supplemental Rules available at https://missa.hssailing.org/about/missa-district-rules apply.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 The sailing instructions will be available no later than 1200 Friday, September 15, 2023, on Techscore Regatta page.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at https://scores.hssailing.org/
- On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors & coaches on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SIs.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 This event is a MISSA Tier #3 regatta, open to 7th-12th grades from mixed schools. Complete teams from a single school must be made first, before combining to form mixed teams. MISSA teams must be in good standing.
- Boats may enter the event by registering online at: https://plss.sportngin.com/register/form/233065610
- 4.3 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees no later than 1200 Friday, September 8, 2023 or until 21 teams have registered, whichever may come first.
- 4.5 The following restrictions on the number of boats apply: the first 21 TEAMS to register and pay will have access to supplied boats. Registration will CLOSE after 21 teams have completed registration which may be prior to the entry deadline on 9/8/23.

5 FEES

- **5.1** Entry fees are as follows: \$50 per sailor. Teams consist of a minimum of 4 sailors and a maximum of 8 sailors.
- Lunch will be included both Saturday and Sunday for registered sailors and 1 coach (listed in the registration). Additional lunches may be purchased for \$12/day.

6 SCHEDULE

- **6.1** The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race is 1000.
- 6.2 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1400.

7 COURSES

7.1 Courses will be set and sailed in accordance with the recommendations set forth in the ISSA Procedural Rules 2021-2024. Any changes will be noted in the Sailing Instructions.

8 SCORING

- **8.1** A minimum of three races in each division is required for a regatta to be scored.
- A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores, in accordance with ISSA PR.

9 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

9.1 Support vessels shall keep clear of the racecourse and only coach from the SI designated area between races.

10 RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

11 PRIZES

11.1 Trophies will be given for 1st-3rd place overall, first place for each division, and Sportsmanship.

12 COVID-19

12.1 The sailing instructions may specify additional ISSA PR changes that affect the schedule, including (but not limited to): limiting equipment rotations, limiting sailor rotations between divisions, scheduling divisions during separate times, or sailing both divisions concurrently on the water.
