1 RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the 2025-2028 ISAF RRS, the prescriptions of the US Sailing Association, the ISSA PR's, this NOR, MISSA By-Laws and District Rules, and the Sailing Instructions.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 The sailing instructions will be available no later than September 5th, 2025 at 5:00 pm on the Clubspot website.

3 COMMUNICATION

3.2 On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors and coaches on VHF Channel 69 for the C420/ILCA course and 68 for the Opti course

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

4.1 The 420 and Laser divisions are limited to High School Teams only. No 8th graders or mixed teams can compete in the 420 division, and no 7th graders can participate in the Laser division.

4.2 Entries must be received by Friday, August 29th at 8:00 pm CST.

4.3 Each Team must register online at the regatta page. HS 420 teams register **per school**, and ILCA and Opti teams register **individually**. Each school may enter no more than one (1) C420 team. If you're interested in having a second team, please contact katie@sheridanshore.org and she will allocate additional berths as they become available.

5 FEES

5.1 Entry fee is \$100 per HS Team, \$35 per Laser and \$35 per Opti

5.2 Lunch is not provided. Trophies will be awarded to the top 3 teams in each fleet.

5.3 By registering for this regatta, in place of paying a damage deposit, a team agrees to pay the cost of any damages deemed responsible for by the host/protest committee/organizing authority, as well as the

cost of any damages that cannot be attributed to a specific incident/team that is divided between the participants.

6 COACHING

6.1. Coaches must provide their coach boat, which serves as their team's designated coaching platform.

6.2. Sheridan Shore Sailing School will not provide boats for teams to use as their coaching platform.

6.3. Coaches are required to:

a Wear an approved flotation device as required by ISSA PR 2.2.

b Wear kill cords/engine cut-off devices on all vessels while afloat.

7 SCHEDULE

Saturday, September 6

8:30 a.m. - Arrival

9:15 a.m. - Competitor's meeting

9:45 a.m. - Harbor Launch

10:15 a.m. – First warning signal - if all teams are ready, we will start before this time

Sunday, September 7

8:30 a.m. - Arrival

9:15 a.m. - Harbor Launch

10:00 a.m. - 420 warning signal - if all teams are ready, we will start before this time

No races will be started after 3:00 pm.

8 COURSES

8.1 Courses will be a variation of Windward/Leeward with an offset mark and Leeward Gate as needed. There may be a dog-leg finish.

9 SCORING

9.1 A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores, per the low-point scoring system

9.2 There shall be no throw-out races for High School 420 or Laser Division, 1 throw-out after six (6) races, and 2 throw-outs after eleven (11) races in the optimist fleets.

10 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

10.1 Spectator and support vessels shall keep clear of the race course and only coach from the leeward/starboard side of the starting area. Green fleet coaches may coach during races as needed.

10.2 Each team/program should have enough support boats for the number of competitors from their club

10.3 All coaches must wear an Engine Cut-Off Switch (ECOS) and a USCG Approved PFD while operating their safety/support boat.

11 RISK STATEMENT

11.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, decision to race.

11.2 In consideration for permitting the undersigned skipper and boat owner, if different from skipper, to participate in a regatta sponsored by the Sheridan Shore Sailing School and conducted at, adjacent to,

and through the facilities of the Wilmette Harbor Association (“WHA”) and the Wilmette Harbor Club (“WHC”), each of the undersigned agrees to the following:

11.2(a) I will abide by the rules and regulations of the SSSS, the WHA, and the WHC.

11.2(b) I understand that, because of the nature of sailing, competitive sailboat racing and the “Kick-off Classic” regatta, there is a risk of physical injury on shore and off shore during the regatta. I hereby release and agree not to sue SSSS, WHA, WHC, Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (“MWRD”), NSA Properties, Inc. (“NSA”), and their employees, subcontractors, sponsors, agents, affiliates, directors, members (except in their capacity as race competitors), event volunteers, counsel or attorneys (collectively, “Releasees”) from all present and future claims that may be made by me, my family, estate, heirs or assigns for property damage, personal injury, or wrongful death arising out of my participation in the regatta, including, but not limited to, claims arising out of or resulting from (1) acts, inactions, equipment, property (including adjacent property) or other facilities of Releasees or any of them, and (2) any acts or inactions by me, my crew or my guests, wherever, whenever, or however the same may occur.

11.2(c) I understand and agree that the Releasees are not responsible for any personal injury or property damage arising out of the regatta, even if caused by their ordinary negligence; provided, however, that I do not release any claims or rights against any competitors in the regatta for any wrongful acts by them, including damage to property or personal injury. I understand that participation in the regatta involves certain risks, including but not limited to serious injury. I, by voluntarily participating in the regatta with knowledge of the danger involved, agree to accept all risks of such participation.

11.2(d) I have read this form and understand by registering for this regatta that I am giving up and releasing rights and remedies.

12 PRIZES

12.1 Trophies will be awarded to the top 3 boats in each fleet.

13 PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO RIGHTS

13.1 Competitors give absolute rights and permission for any photographs or video footage taken of themselves or their competing boat to be published in any media whatsoever for editorial, commercial purposes, or to be used in press information.
