## 1 RULES

### 1.1

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.

### 1.2

The Official Procedural Rules for Interscholastic Sailing Competition and the MISSA By-laws and District Rules will apply.

### 1.3

The following US Sailing Prescriptions will not apply: 60.3(b), 63.2, and 63.4.

## 2 ELIGIBILITY

This event is open to MISSA member schools in good standing, who have qualified at their area qualifier.

## 3 ENTRY

### 3.1

A team may enter the regatta by completing the entry form and submitting the entry fee no later than the entry deadline, the online entry form is available at:

### 3.2

The entry deadline is 1700 on Friday, April 20th.

### 3.3

Completed team roster, medical, and liability forms shall be submitted to the LMSS or PLSS Director no later than 0845 on Saturday, April 28th.

### 3.4

A team that withdraws from the regatta after the entry deadline or fails to compete at the event will forfeit its entry fee and the vacated berth may be filled at the MISSA Board's discretion.

### 3.5

The top four finishing teams will earn a berth to Mallory National Championship in Seabrook, TX and the next four to the Phoebe King Memorial in Annapolis, MD. All teams must confirm acceptance of their berth in accordance with MISSA rule 5.11.

## 4 FEES

### 4.1

The entry fee is \$45 per competitor. This includes lunch on Saturday and Sunday for each sailor and team coaches.

### 4.2

Each team must submit a refundable boat damage deposit of \$250 no later than 0845 on Saturday, April 28th. The Damage Deposit is refundable if the boats and gear are returned undamaged. In the event damage cannot be attributed to a particular team, the repair costs will be divided evenly amongst all the competing teams.

## 5 BOATS

PLSS will provide 20 Collegiate 420s. Boats shall be sailed as provided.

## 6 RACING AREA

The race area will be on the main bay of Lake Pewaukee. The specific race area selection will be made by the race officer and the regatta organizer each day of the regatta and announced at the competitors meeting.

## 7 SCHEDULE

Saturday, April 28

0830 – Registration, rigging of boats

0915 – Competitor meeting. All competitors shall attend the competitor meeting

1000 – First warning. Races will continue throughout the day

Sunday, April 29

0830 – Rigging of boats

0930 – Warning signal for first race

1500 – No race will start after this time

## 8 COACHING

Coaching will be allowed on the water for transfer of team members and must stay in a designated area. Coaches must provide their own boats. A few coach boats will be available for East teams upon request.

## 9 HOUSING

Limited housing may be available. Teams may contact the housing coordinator no later than Tuesday, April 17th to request accommodations with area families.

## 10 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

## 11 PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO RIGHTS

Competitors give absolute right and permission for any photographs or video footage taken of themselves or their competing boat to be published in any media whatsoever for editorial, commercial purposes, or to be used in press information.
