Notice of Race

1. RULES:

- 1.1 - This regatta will be governed by the current Racing Rules of Sailing, this NoR, and the SIs, with the SIs taking precedence in the event of a conflict.
- 1.2 - The Organizing Authority (OA) is the Wellesley High School Sailing Team.
- 1.3 - The venue will be Lake Cochituate, in Natick, MA. Meet at 225 Commonwealth Rd, Natick, MA.

2. ELIGIBILITY & TEAM COMPOSITION:

- 2.1 - This regatta is open to all female high-school sailors.
- 2.2 - Teams that are unable to send three complete boats are still welcome to participate, and will be grouped into compound teams with other partial teams, with potential for rotating teams.

3. BOATS:

- 3.1 - Collegiate 420s provided by the OA.
- 3.2 - Boats will be sailed as provided.

4. UMPIRES:

- 4.1 - Every effort will be made to make this an umpired event in accordance with RRS D2.
- 4.2 - Depending on event enrollment and umpire volunteers, this could mean rule D2.6 (Limited Umpiring) is in effect, or that protests are settled in accordance with the norms of high school sailing.

5. SCHEDULE:

- 5.1 - Saturday, April 23, 2022 — **CLINIC DAY**
 - 0830 – Check in/registration/rigging of boats
 - 1030 – Clinics begin with guest coaches.
 - 1630 – Day wraps up.
- 5.2 - Sunday, May 5, 2019 — **RACE DAY**
 - 0830 – Check in/registration/rigging of boats
 - 0900 – Coaches' meeting
 - 0915 – Sailor's meeting & team composition
 - 1700 – No first warning for any race may start after this time. Trophy presentation after last race.
- 5.3 - Teams are welcome to register for the clinic day, the race day, or both. We're very sorry that this event comes at the end of April Vacation, but it is the only possible weekend.
- 5.4 - Changes to the schedule will be posted on the official notice board whose location will be announced at the sailors meeting.

6. COURSES:

- 6.1 - The Race Committee will determine the courses based on conditions, with a strong preference for a digital N.

7. SCORING:

- 7.1 - The regatta will be scored in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules.

8. PRIZES:

- 8.1 - Prizes will be awarded to schools or compound teams placing 1st, 2nd, and 3rd.

9. WAIVER OF LIABILITY:

- 9.1 - Sailing is an activity with inherent risk of damage or injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race.
