1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing for 2013-2016, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the ISSA Procedural Rules, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions.
 - A. The US Sailing prescriptions to rules 60, 63.2, and 63.4 will not be in effect; and
 - B. Under rule 70.5(a), the right of appeal is denied

2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 Current ISSA and NWISA membership is required and will be verified at the time of final registration at the regatta site.
- 2.2 A responsible adult leader must accompany teams at all times

3. ENTRY AND COMMUNICATIONS

- 3.1 Eligible schools shall email Regatta Coordinator: Scott Wilson: scottjwilson@gmail.com their intent to participate and total number of sailors attending no later than 4/3/15.
- 3.2 Teams unable to compete shall notify the Regatta Coordinator as soon as possible.
- 3.3 Sat: lunch, Sun: continental breakfast and lunch will be provided.

1130 First Warning: Racing will continue throughout the day.

Eat during boat rotation – no lunch break. Sailors will make sack lunches between 930 and 1100 am.

Racing will continue until late.

Saturday, April 12, 2014

0800 Report Time Continental Breakfast and Lunch available

0930 First Warning: Racing will continue throughout the day.

Eat during boat rotation – no lunch break. Sailors will make sack lunches between 800 and 930 am.

1500 No Warning after this time.

1630 Awards presentation, or after completion of racing.

Any changes to the schedule will be posted on the Official Notice Board on the East entry door of the Seafarer's Park building.

6. RACING AREA

6.1 The racing area will be in Fidalgo Bay, South of the breakwater at Cap Sante Marina, East of the breakwater at Seafarer Memorial Park.

6.2 Rotations will take place at the dock within the Seafarer's Park breakwater.

7. COURSES

7.1 Based on conditions, the Race Committee will determine the courses. Short collegiate style courses will be used.

8. SCORING

8.1 The regatta will be scored in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules.

9. FORMAT

9.1 The Regatta will be sailed with one division on the water at a time. If enough teams attend, teams may be separated into two fleets at the discretion of the race committee each with an A and B division. Two races will constitute one rotation.

10. LODGING

10.1 Saturday night, billeting is available at the High School Gym and Mat room. Contact the Regatta Chair for arrangements.

10.2 You must provide your own sleeping bag and pillow. Bring your own snacks.

10.3 Each team is responsible for supervising their sailors at all times during the regatta and must have an adult chaperone representing the team, accompanying team members at any sleeping arrangement.

11. TRAVEL

11.1 Directions to sailing venue: Seafarer's Memorial Park, from Highway 20: continue on Hwy 20 spur west towards Anacortes; right on "Q" Avenue; right on Seafarers Way.

12. COACHING

12.1 Team leaders, chaperones, coaches, parents, advisors and other support personnel shall not go afloat in the sailing area from the start of racing Saturday to the end of racing Sunday UNLESS an exception has been explicitly permitted by the regatta chair or PRO.

12.2 Competitors may receive coaching including instructions, assistance, equipment or sustenance only while on the designated rotation float or on shore.

13. PRIZES

13.1 Prizes will be awarded to the teams placing first, second, and third.

14. OFFICIAL NOTICE FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS

14.1 No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, distilled spirits), or use any controlled substance (marijuana, cocaine, etc.), the possession of which is unlawful. An alleged breach of this rule and/or other disciplinary matters that occur may be the basis for a hearing under rule 69.1. The protest committee for such a hearing will be the Regatta Chairperson, a member of the NWISA Board of Directors and the chairperson of the protest committee.
