1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing for 2017-2020, including Appendix D, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the ISSA Procedural Rules, the NWISA District Rules, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2 Limited umpiring will be NOT be used. This changes ISSA Procedural Rule 12.
- 1.3 The US Sailing prescriptions to rule 60, 63.2 and 63.4 are deleted and will not apply.
- 1.4 Under rule 70.5(a), the right of appeal is denied.

2. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

2.1 The official notice board will be at the boat ramp info Kiosk at Waterfront Park until racing starts, at which time it will be moved to the dock near the rotation float at the Eagle Harbor Marina, unless it is raining in which case it will be moved to the head of the dock/marina office out of the rain.

3. ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 This is an 'Open Regatta' as described in the NWISA District Rules. 'Active' and 'Mixed' teams may attend.
- 3.2 Teams shall be comprised of a minimum of 6 sailors. Multiple teams per school are allowed (limited by boat availability).
- 3.3 Teams shall be accompanied by a designated adult team leader, who may be an advisor, coach or parent recognized by the school.
- 3.4 Sailors shall be from the **SOUTH** region as designated on the NWISA website: <u>https://nwisa.hssailing.org/about/regions</u>. Schools wishing to compete but are not sure which region they belong should contact Scott Wilson, <u>scottjwilson@gmail.com</u>, 360-303-1759.

4. ENTRY AND COMMUNICATIONS

- **4.1** Eligible schools shall register through the NWISA website link. Registration is on a first come, first served if berths are limited. <u>Registration opens</u> 3/12/2018 at 1100.
- **4.2** <u>Registration closes</u> 3/19/2018 at 2200. Additional registrations are allowed after this time, but teams may be turned away if event capacity is reached.
- 4.3 The regatta will be limited to the first 10 teams registered after registration opens. Registration priority will be given as follows:
 - 1. Host Active Schools
 - 2. Varsity Active Schools (1st team)

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- 3. Program Mixed 1st Teams
- 4. JV Active Schools (2nd or 3rd teams)
- 5. Program Mixed 2nd or 3rd teams
- **4.4** Teams unable to compete once registration closes shall notify the regatta chair as soon as possible.
- **4.5** Each competitor must have a signed EVENT WAIVER on file (ATTACHED).
- 4.6 Each competing program must have a damage deposit on file with NWISA per District rule 7.3.
- 4.7 Eligible schools shall email Christine Campbell at <u>campbell98110@gmail.com</u> their intent to participate and total number of sailors attending no later than **March 19, 2018**.
- 4.8 Entry fees will not be required for this one day event. No food will be provided, however a food truck will be on site.

5. BOATS

- 5.1 Races will be sailed in a fleet of 6 420s and 12 Flying Juniors
- 5.2 Competitors shall report any damage to a boat or loss of equipment, however slight, to the Dock Captain immediately upon completion of the race in which it occurs.
- 5.3 The rotation schedule distributed at the coaches meeting shall be used to determine which group of boats a given team sails in a given race. It is the responsibility of each team to ensure that the rotation schedule is followed.
- 5.4 A team exiting a boat shall not leave the boat unattended until the next team takes possession of the boat for the next race.

Any changes to the schedule will be posted on the Official Notice Board.

7. RACING AREA

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- 7.1 The launching area will be the public docks at Eagle Harbor Waterfront Park (see end of document)
- 7.2 The racing area will in Eagle Harbor.
- 7.3 Rotations for both fleets will be from the docks at Eagle Harbor Marina. (see attached).

8. COURSES

8.1 A digital 'N' course will be used.

10. The regatta will be scored in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules.

11. TRAVEL

11.1 Directions to sailing venue can be found at the end of this NOR

12. COACHING

- 12.1 Team leaders, chaperones, coaches, parents, advisors and other support personnel shall not go afloat in the sailing area from the start of racing Saturday to the end of racing Saturday UNLESS an exception has been explicitly permitted by the regatta chair or PRO.
- 12.2 Competitors may receive coaching including instructions, assistance, equipment or sustenance only while on the designated rotation float or on shore.

12.3 Viewing area for spectators will be at Pritchard Park on Eagle Harbor Dr. NE, Bainbridge Island, WA 98110 (Shown at end of this NOR)

13. OFFICIAL NOTICE FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS

13.1 No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, distilled spirits), or use any controlled substance (marijuana, cocaine, etc.), the possession of which is unlawful. An alleged breach of this rule and/or other disciplinary matters that occur may be the basis for a hearing under rule 69.1. The protest committee for such a hearing will be the Regatta Chairperson, a member of the NWISA Board of Directors and the chairperson of the protest committee.
