2019 PCISA Pacific Coast Championship

NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the current ISSA Procedural Rules (as modified by the PCISA District Rules).
- **1.2** The Organizing Authority (OA) is the Pacific Coast Interscholastic Sailing Association (PCISA) in conjunction with the host Mission Bay Yacht Club (MBYC).

2. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 2.1 Competing schools must be members of ISSA and meet all ISSA eligibility rules as prescribed in the ISSA Procedural Rules. PCISA District Rules 3.3 (8th Graders), 4 (Borrowed Sailors) & 5 (Combined teams) are NOT in effect for this event. PCISA District Rule 12.2 (Gold Fleet Skipper Limits) IS in effect for this event.
- 2.2 This regatta will allow approximately 30 maximum berths. The PCISA Board has the final authority over these berths in accordance with PCISA District Rule 6 and using PCISA District Rule 8 as guideline.
- **2.3** Eligible teams shall consist of an A and B Division. A minimum of 4 sailors and maximum of 8 sailors are allowed per team.
- 2.4 Eligible schools shall enter by completing the online entry form located at: https://hssailing.org/machform/view.php?id=109116 and submitting payment by 1700 hours on Friday, March 29th.

3. FEES

The entry fee is \$200.00 for the first 4 sailors and 1 coach and \$30.00 for each additional team member. Entry fee includes PCISA sails, a t-shirt for each paid sailor and coach, BBQ on the beach after racing on Saturday and snacks after racing on Sunday. Additional t-shirts may be available for purchase. All payments shall be made via the online registration system.

4. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

5. BOATS & SAILS

- **5.1** Each Team shall bring a complete CFJ Class Legal Boat in excellent racing condition. The team will enter this boat in the regatta rotation and use this boat in the first rotation.
- **5.2** Each boat shall be inspected prior to the Competitors' meeting on Saturday.
- **5.3** Each boat is required to use the sails supplied by PCISA.
- A limited number of Charter Boats are available by reservation on the Online Entry Form for \$200 each (for the regatta). Questions on charter boats contact Chris Wright, juniors@mbyc.org

6. RACING AREA & LAUNCHING

The racing area will be in Mission Bay near MBYC. All boats shall launch from and return to MBYC each day.

7. PRACTICE

Teams wishing to practice on Friday, April 13th shall email Chris Wright <u>juniors@mbyc.org</u>. Practice is allowed from 1400-1700 hours; boats are not allowed on the water outside of this time period. Teams may arrive at MBYC any time after 1300 hours on Friday.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions and other documents will be posted on the official regatta notice board and on Techscore. Paper copies will NOT be available on site.

9. COACHING

Coaching may be done from the rotation site (pier, docks, or beach). Team leaders, chaperones, coaches, parents, advisors and other support personnel shall not have any contact with competitors while on the water from reporting Saturday to ending Sunday unless explicitly permitted by the OA. The penalty for failing to comply with this requirement may be the disqualification of all boats, competitors and teams associated with the infringing support personnel from the races following and/or preceding the infraction, at the discretion of the jury.

10. PARTICIPATION

With the exception of RRS Rule 4, each school shall compete in all scheduled races, or if unable to compete, shall take care of their assigned boat. Any school breaking this rule, without permission of the Race Committee, is subject to severe disciplinary actions by the Jury and/or PCISA.

11. JUDGING/PROTEST

- **11.1** Judges or observers may be on the water. They will act in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules, Appendix 4. Appendix P (as modified by ISSA Procedural Rules Rule 14.c) will be in effect.
- 11.2 Protests will be handled in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules. The Jury may hear protests between races on the water or in a designated location determined by the Race Committee.

12. TROPHIES

Prizes will be awarded to schools placing in the top five in the regatta.

13. HOUSING

Housing is the responsibility of each team.
