NOTICE OF RACE

Address: Crosswinds Boating Center, 565 Farrington Road, Apex, NC 27523

Overview: We look forward to having a strong turnout and putting on a first class SAISA points regatta to replace the original regatta cancelled due to the hurricane. The venue provides an excellent raised viewing area for all coaches and parents if the wind is out of the traditional direction. The RTP High School Sailing Program will be serving a lunch on-site for those sailors and guest that pre-order lunches. The Race Committee that has been assembled has significant experience running high school and college regattas.

1. RULES:

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the ISSA Procedural Rules, the 2016 SAISA Supplemental Rules, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions. In the event of a conflict between the governing documents and the Sailing Instructions, the latter shall take precedence.
- 1.2. RRS Appendix P is in effect modified per ISSA Procedural Rule 14(c).
- 1.3. In accordance with rule 70.5(a), decisions of the protest committee are final. US SAILING's permission has been granted.
- 1.4. The Organizing Authority (OA) is the interscholastic Sailing Association (ISSA) in conjunction with the South Atlantic Interscholastic Sailing Association (SAISA) and the RTP High School Sailing Program and the Carolina Sailing Foundation.

2. ELIGIBILITY:

- 2.1. Competing schools must be current members of ISSA and SAISA and meet eligibility rules as prescribed in the Procedural Rules, and Supplemental Rules.
- 2.2. Teams must be accompanied by a designated adult team leader, who may be an advisor, coach or parent recognized by the school. The team leader must have the authority to authorize medical care for all sailors on their team.

3. FORMAT

- 3.1. This will be a two-division regatta. Teams will rotate per a rotation chart distributed at the Competitor's Meeting or they will be posted online at techscore for this event.
- 3.2. Three races in each division must be completed to constitute a regatta.

4. ENTRY AND COMMUNICATIONS:

- 4.1. Eligible schools and sailors must enter by submitting an official entry form and check with the regatta chairperson by 8pm **Wednesday Oct. 31, 2018**. Send all forms and checks to: Howard Ferguson, 210 Shadow Hawk Dr, Durham, NC 27713.

- 4.3. Registration will be confirmed via mail or phone, if email is not available.
- 4.4. Split teams, composite teams and Junior Varsity teams are permitted to register per SAISA Supplemental Rules. Such Teams will not be scored officially for the regatta and the SAISA League Series in accordance with the Supplemental Rules. JV/Composite teams will be unofficially scored and posted online during regatta so teams can see how they are doing against the varsity teams.

5. ENTRY FEE:

- 5.1. The entry is \$60.00 per team. This includes up to 5 lunches, snacks, bottled water and drinks. Lunch donation of \$5 for team leaders, coaches and parents. Vegetarian options provided.
- 5.2. Reservations for all lunches MUST BE MADE with registration. Alternate locations for lunch are not very convenient. We highly recommend ordering lunches for all participants, coaches and spectators or bringing your own
- 5.3. Make checks payable to: Carolina Sailing Foundation

6. DAMAGE DEPOSIT:

- 6.1. A damage deposit of \$100 must be submitted with each entry. Actual cost of damage repairs will be charged which may exceed the \$100 deposit. This deposit is refundable if the boat and gear are returned undamaged. In the event damage cannot be attributed to a particular team, the repair costs will be divided evenly amongst all the competing teams.

7. BOATS:

- 7.1. The host will provide **ten (10)** boats. Registration is on a first paid/first allowed basis per the SAISA Supplemental Rules. **Teams that had registered for the original NP #1 date on Sept 15 will receive priority in the order of their original registration followed by additional teams that register.** Note: Regatta Chair is pursuing borrowing boats from other NC junior sailing organizations. If successful additional boats will be assigned in the order of registration.
- 7.2. Teams which register after the total number of provided boats has been allocated will be required to provide a 420 boat and sails of comparable condition to be entered into the rotation. Note that, per supplemental rule 4.5, boats will be assigned first to full teams, then to split teams, composite teams, and JV teams respectively.

8. SCHEDULE:

Saturday

8:00-8:45 Registration at Race site located near the flagpole at Crosswinds Boating Center

9:00 Competitor's Meeting near the flagpole at Crosswinds Boating Center

Racing to follow immediately after

Awards - After boats are de-rigged and stored, Awards near the flagpole

6:00 Optional Group Dinner - At nearby restaurant for all competitors and spectators immediately after awards (sign up during Saturday morning registration)

8.2. Changes to the schedule will be posted on the official notice board located near the flagpole at Crosswinds Boating Center

9. RACING AREA:

- 9.1. All races will be sailed in the section of Jordan Lake running generally to the west by southwest of Crosswinds Boating Center.

10. COURSES:

- 10.1. Based on conditions, the Race Committee will determine the courses as prescribed in ISSA PR 7.7.

11. SCORING:

- 11.1. The regatta will be scored in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules.

12. DIRECTIONS:

- 12.1. Crosswinds Boating Center (565 Farrington Road, Apex, NC 27523) is approximately ½ mile north of highway NC64 on the left/west. Apex is the nearest town and the RDU airport is less than ½ hour away.

13. HOUSING:

- 13.1. There are numerous hotels near Apex, Cary and RDU airport within a 15-30 minute drive to the sailing venue.

14. COACHING:

- 14.1. Coaches shall not go afloat in the sailing area during racing unless explicitly permitted by the regatta chairperson. Chaperones, parents, and other spectators are allowed to go afloat in spectator boats provided by regatta personnel. They may not have any contact with sailors from their child's team. The penalty for failing to comply with this requirement may be the disqualification of all boats, competitors and team associated with the infringing support personnel.

15. OFFICIAL NOTICE:

- 15.1. No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, marijuana or any other controlled substance, as defined in 21 U.S. Code 802, the possession of which is unlawful under U.S. Code 841, or alcoholic beverages (distilled spirits, wine, and beer, each as defined in Chapter 51 of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code and intended for beverage use). An alleged breach of this procedural rule shall not be grounds for a protest. However, when a report is received from any source, alleging such a breach a protest committee shall follow the process described in RRS 69.1(b). If a hearing under RRS 69 is held, a competitor found to have breached this procedural rule shall be excluded from the remaining races of the series and, where practical, be removed from the regatta venues and sent home. Additional penalties consistent with RRS 69.2 may be imposed on the competitor or the competitor's team. This regulation is in effect during the entire event from the date and time of arrival through the date and time of departure from the regatta site.

16. RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS:

- 16.1. By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the Organizing Authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

17. WAIVER OF LIABILITY:

- 17.1. Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race.
- 17.2. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.

18. SAFETY AND SPECIAL CLOTHING:

- 18.1. While on the Rotation Dock and on the water, competitors shall wear clothing appropriate for the conditions. Competitors are required to wear special clothing when the water temperature drops below 60 degrees F or when the combination of air temperature and water temperature is below 120. "Special Clothing" can include either dry suits, or wet suits, or a mid-weight thermal polyester layer covered by a windproof layer. Cotton clothing, including jeans, sweat pants, jackets or suits and t-shirts are prohibited.
- 18.2. Competitors shall wear USCG approved Type III lifejackets. Inflatable type lifejackets are not permitted.
- 18.3. A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee either before leaving the course, or if that is impossible, immediately after arriving ashore.
