# NOTICE OF RACE

## 1. RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the ISSA

Procedural Rules, the Scholastic Dinghy Class Rules, the SAISA District Supplemental Rules and ISSA

Code of Conduct, this NOR, and the Sailing Instructions (SIs). In the event of a conflict, the SIs will take

precedence.

1.2 The Organizing Authority is South Atlantic Interscholastic Sailing Association in conjunction with College of Charleston

1.3 Appendix P. Special Procedures for Rule 42, as modified by ISSA Procedural Rule 14(c) will be in effect.

2. Sailing Instructions: The sailing instructions will be posted on Tech Score prior to the report time for the regatta.

3. Communication: The online official notice board will be Tech Score.

# 2. Eligibility and Entry:

Competing schools must be members of ISSA and meet ISSA eligibility rules as prescribed in the Procedural Rules as prescribed by the SAISA Supplemental Rules. Teams must be accompanied by a designated adult team leader, who may be an advisor, coach or parent recognized by the school. The adult leader must have the authority to authorize medical care for all sailors on their team.

# **3. BOATS, SAILS AND DAMAGE DEPOSIT**

All Races will be sailed in FJs and 420 Sailboats. A damage deposit of \$250.00 addressed to College of

*Charleston Sailing MUST* be provided at check-in. Please place your team's name in the memo.

Teams may not race without a deposit. Checks will be returned or destroyed after the event if there was no damage.

# 6. ENTRIES, ENTRY FEES AND DEPOSIT

An entry form must be completed, and \$250 payment submitted to College of Charleston by April

15th, 2024 at 1700 online using this link: https://secure.touchnet.com/C20590\_ustores/web/product\_detail.jsp?PRODUCTID=715

Damage deposit checks of \$250 described in #3 must be turned in at registration.

# 7. SAILING AREA/LAUNCHING

The sailing area will be in the vicinity of the College of Charleston sailing Center adjacent to the Yorktown on Charleston Harbor. Boat rotations will take place inside of the outer northwest wall of the marina. No on-water coaching will be permitted. Coaching and spectating will be done from off the docks, or the Yorktown. We ask that parents and spectators stay off the outer wall dock during rotation. In the unlikely situation that the sailing conditions make sailing in this area challenging, the course may be moved to Crab Back, southeast of the marina. In this case, all coaches will be brought out on the water.

## 8. PARTICIPATION

All teams must complete online RP forms in Tech Score. Failure to comply will result in penalties. Team pinnies must be worn. Penalty will be applied per the ISSA Procedural Rules. No hearing is required.

With the exception of RRS Rule 3, each school shall compete in all scheduled races, or if unable to compete, shall take care of their assigned boat in each race. Any school breaking this rule without permission of the Race Committee is subject to severe disciplinary actions by the ICSA. All sailors should bring their own refillable water bottles. Water refill stations will be available on and off the water.

## 9. COACHING AND SPECTATING

Team leaders, chaperones, coaches, parents, advisors, and other team support personnel shall not go afloat from 0600 Saturday, April 25th to after racing has ended on Sunday unless explicitly permitted by the regatta organizer. The penalty for failing to comply with this requirement may be the disqualification of all boats, competitors and teams associated with the infringing support personnel. For high school teams, an adult school representative/advisor is required to accompany each team and be responsible for their conduct on and off the water. The team representative, who may be an advisor, a coach or parent is expected to have full authority to obtain medical treatment for team members and the ability to access the team's proficiency to sail in varied conditions that may be encountered. *Please note:* spectators may take advantage of discounted tickets for entrance to the Yorktown (that will provide excellent spectating adjacent to the proposed Racecourse.) Tickets will be available at the competitors meeting.

#### **10. SCORING**

The regatta will be scored in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rules. There will be no throw outs. This regatta will use electronic RP Forms using the TechScore program. Scores can be viewed through TechScore.

#### 11. Awards

Awards will be given to teams placing 1st, 2nd, and 3<sup>rd</sup> along with berths for the Nationals based on our ISSA SAISA Allowance.

## **13. OFFICIAL NOTICE**

No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, marijuana, or any other controlled substance, as defined in 21 U.S. Code 802, the possession of which is unlawful under U.S. Code 841, or alcoholic beverages (distilled spirits, wine, and beer, each as defined in Chapter 51 of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code and intended for beverage use). An alleged breach of this procedural rule shall not be grounds for a protest. This changes RRS 60.1(a). However, when a report is received from any source, alleging such a breach a protest committee consisting of the regatta chairperson, a member of the ISSA Board of Directors, and the chairperson of the protest committee, shall follow the process described in RRS 69.1(b). If a hearing under RRS 69 is held, a competitor found to have breached this procedural rule shall be excluded from the remaining races of the series and, where practical, be removed from the

regatta venues and sent home. Additional penalties consistent with RRS 69.2 may be imposed on the competitor or the competitor's team. This regulation is in effect during the entire event from the date and time of arrival through the date and time of departure from the regatta site.

## **14. RIGHTS TO USE NAMES AND LIKENESS**

By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the Organizing Authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

#### **15. WAIVER OF LIABILITY-LINK TO SIGN**

Sailors and coaches **must open and sign** the following C of C sailing liability waiver before the event starts. Failure to sign this online waiver will result in the inability to compete.

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
