Note: due to absences incurred by Hurricane Helene, this event no longer is no longer a Points League Series Regatta, however all procedural rules for Points Regattas remain in effect.

This event remains the SAISA Atlantic Coast Championship Qualifier.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the ISSA Procedural Rules, the SAISA Supplemental Rules, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions. In the event of a conflict between the governing documents and the Sailing Instructions the latter shall take precedence.
- 1.2 Contestants are strongly encouraged to bring refillable water bottles. No drinks are provided other than water from large coolers.
- 1.3 Light breakfast and hot lunch will be provided for registered sailors, see NOR 3.3.
- 1.4 Each Varsity, Junior Varsity, Composite and Split team must bring their own high-school compliant 420 and equipment, will sail their own boat in each race, and will not rotate with other teams (see NOR 5.1).
- 1.5 Upon arrival at the regatta each boat will be inspected by the regatta chair or their designee and if deemed unacceptable then that team will not be allowed to participate in the regatta. Possible reasons for rejection would include any piece of equipment that provides a significant advantage **or would unreasonably slow the pace of the event.**
- 1.6 If six or more JV, Composite and Split teams register for a SAISA Points Regatta the Regatta Chair may decide to have a separate start on the same or different course for these teams. If so, this will be announced at the skippers meeting (SAISA District Supplemental Rule 4.9). Split, Composite and JV teams must coordinate with other teams to field a complete two division team of four or more sailors to register (SAISA 4.4.1).

2 ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 Before competing, all teams must be full dues paid members of SAISA and all competitors must be registered with and appear in the online roster (ISSA Database) of the school that they attend or their assigned school. Failure for a competitor to be on this roster may be grounds for disqualification of the team in any and all races in which that competitor sailed. See SAISA District Supplemental Rules 2.6.

- 2.2 Each team must bring their own 420 dolly to transport their boat from the trailer in the parking lot to the beach for launching.
- 2.3 Junior Varsity (JV) teams, Composite and Split teams teams will be scored for the regatta and the League Series in accordance with the Supplemental Rules.
- 2.4 Teams must be accompanied by a designated adult team leader, who may be an advisor, coach or parent authorized by the school. The event has no limitation on support persons or spectators beyond those in the ISSA or SAISA rules.

3 ENTRY

- 3.1 Eligible schools and sailors who did not submit an entry fee for the originally-scheduled date of the event must bring a check for the Entry Fee to the regatta. All teams must be paid prior to racing.
- 3.2 Entry forms and liability waivers must be emailed to raidersailing1@gmail.com to the regatta chairperson by **Wednesday, September 25, 2024**, even if previously submitted.
- 3.3 The entry fee is \$115.00 per team and includes a light breakfast for up to 8 sailors per team and one coach (bagels, juice, coffee) and lunch (hot dogs & hamburgers grilled to your liking, vegan options, chips and dessert. Additional meal tickets can be purchased for a \$10.00 donation via cash or Zelle. Breakfast and lunch will be served shore side under the Pavilion.

4 DAMAGE

- 4.1 In accordance with RRS 14 and 60.2, the Race Committee may protest any boat for contact that causes damage, including to Race Committee and other vessels. In case of serious damage, the protest committee may award penalties greater than disqualification, including DNE for one or more races or exclusion from the event. See ISSA Procedural Rule 15 regarding Serious Collisions.

5 BOATS

- 5.1 Each team must bring their own boat and equipment, and will sail their own boat in each race. This changes ISSA Procedural Rules 7.4 and 7.7(a); and SAISA Supplemental Rules 4.5 and 4.6.
- 5.2 All Varsity boats will be assigned jibs at Check-in/Registration that must be used for the duration of the event unless permission for a substitution is given by the Regatta Chair or PRO. **Teams must supply their own jib sheets.**
- 5.3 All JV boats shall have sail numbers on their mainsail.
- 5.4 Since all equipment is provided by each team, no redress shall be given under ISSA Procedural Rule 9(e), except for a breakdown of a jib provided by the Organizing Authority. Similarly, competitors are responsible for maintaining and repairing their boats as needed during the event and should not rely on event staff.

6 SCHEDULE:

Saturday, September 28, 2024:

0715 Team arrival, rigging, and check-in at the Pavilion

0715 – 0830 Rigging of boats

0815 Registration closes

0830 Skipper's meeting at the Pavilion

0915 First warning signal scheduled

6.1 Racing may be held on an alternate date if conditions prevent completion of an adequate number of races.

6.2 Changes to the schedule will be posted on the Official Notice Board located at the Pavilion.

7 RACING AREA

The Racing Area is North Lake, south of Holland Park, west of the Intracoastal. Rotations will take place in the shallow water just off the beach on the south side of Holland Park.

8 COURSES

The Race Committee will determine the courses as prescribed in ISSA PR 7.7.

9 STARTS & SCORING

9.1 The regatta will be scored in accordance with ISSA Procedural Rule 9(a).

9.2 If JV, Split, and Composite Teams race with Varsity per NOR 1.5, these teams will be scored as JV teams and will not be eligible for Points regatta trophies.

10 HOUSING

No Housing is provided. Hotels nearby would be in Hollywood, Dania Beach, or North Miami.

11 TRAVEL AND TRANSPORTATION

Competitors traveling by air should use the Fort Lauderdale / Hollywood International Airport or Miami International Airport.

12 COACHING

Coaches, advisors, parents, and support personnel shall not go afloat in the Racing Area (see NOR 7) from Saturday 0845 to the end of the regatta unless explicitly permitted by the Regatta Chair or PRO.

13 OFFICIAL NOTICE

No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, marijuana or any other controlled substance, as defined in 21 U.S. Code 802, the possession of which is unlawful under U.S. Code 841, or alcoholic beverages (distilled spirits, wine, and beer, each as defined in Chapter 51 of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code and intended for beverage use). An alleged breach of this procedural rule shall not be grounds for a protest. However, when a report is received from any source, alleging such a breach a protest committee consisting of the regatta chairperson, a member of the ISSA Board of Directors, and the chairperson of the protest committee, shall follow the process described in RRS 69.1(b). If a hearing under RRS 69 is held, a competitor found to have breached this procedural rule shall be excluded from the remaining races of the series and, where practical, be removed from the regatta venues and sent home. Additional penalties consistent with RRS 69.2 may be imposed on the competitor or the competitor's team. This regulation is in effect during the entire event from the date and time of arrival through the date and time of departure from the regatta site.

14 RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the Organizing Authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

15 WAIVER OF LIABILITY

- 15.1 Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race.
- 15.2 The race organizers (including the organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the illness or injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
