NOTICE OF RACE

HOST: Ransom Everglades School

January 19, 2019

SITE: Harry Anderson Water Sports Center (Ransom Everglades Upper School Waterfront)

1. RULES

This regatta will be governed by the current ISSA Procedural Rules and SAISA Supplementary Rules, *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the prescriptions of US SAILING, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions. Advertising will be restricted to Category A.

2. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Saturday, Jan 19th

0800 Arrival and check-in, boat rigging

0900 Competitors' meeting (all boats must be rigged)

1000 Start of first race of the day

The R/C reserves the right to start any race if it feels teams have been given ample time to transit to the starting area from the rigging area or rotation location.

*One day regatta: **Saturday racing only.***

3. FORMAT

This will be a two-division regatta; teams will sail two races as a set, then direct swap rotate through the boats per a rotation posted on the day of the event. In order to direct swap we must have an even number of boats in varsity fleets. In the event an odd number of varsity teams register the last school to register by the deadline will be invited to race JV. Due to waterfront dock damage after Hurricane Irma, we have a smaller footprint of floating dock to rotate and a direct swap will quicken the rotations. A Sound Signal Starting System shall be used. Competitors should expect numerous short races of 15-20 min in duration with boat rotations as set forth at the skipper's meeting. It shall be the goal of the race committee to complete as many competitive races as possible. Three races in each division must be completed to constitute a regatta. All coaching, including instruction, assistance, equipment or sustenance shall be provided only on shore.

4. SCORING

4.1 Low point system for individual races as modified by ISSA Rule 9. Ties will be resolved per procedural rule 11(c).

4.2 Protests hearings, if any, may take place between races.

4.3 Race Participation (RP) Forms must be completed on Techscore per team. The team representative must have the online form completed 30 minutes after fleet returns to the dock. Incomplete forms and/or substitution issues can result in penalties ranging from disqualification to 20 additional points.

5. FEES

The entry fee shall be **\$35.00** per each varsity school team and **\$35.00** per each JV school team, paid in advance by using the registration and waiver forms available on the South Atlantic Interscholastic Sailing

Association website (<http://saisa.hssailing.org/>) listed under "General Forms"

Registration Deadline: All participating teams must register for this event by January 17th.

6. ELIGIBILITY

6.1 All current Member school teams of the South Atlantic Interscholastic Sailing Association (SAISA) are welcome. The regatta is a South Points Regatta. Points will also be awarded to qualify for participation in the Mallory District Championship & Qualifier for ISSA fleet racing nationals, within the South Atlantic District.

6.2 All teams must be members in good standing with SAISA. If a team wishes to participate, and has not yet paid the ISSA/SAISA dues, they will be provided the opportunity to pay dues at check-in. All schools must be members in good standing with SAISA. If a school wishes to participate, and has not yet paid the ISSA/SAISA dues, they will be provided the opportunity to pay dues at check-in as long as they have an online "Pending" status and their online team roster matches the venues regatta registration list. A team is composed of one or more ISSA/SAISA registered sailors attending a high school full time.

6.3 Registration is on a first paid/first allowed basis with a maximum number of varsity teams limited to 30 boats, which will be supplied by Ransom Everglades School.

6.4 Competitors must attend the school they represent full time and must be in the 9-12 grades, as of the date of the Regatta and must be listed on their ISSA/SAISA online team roster.

6.5 An adult school representative/advisor is required to accompany each team and be responsible for their conduct on and off the water. The team representative, who may be an advisor, coach, or parent, is expected to have full authority to obtain medical treatment for his team members and have the ability to monitor his/her teams' experience in their proficiency to sail in varied conditions as may be encountered.

6.6 Eligible SAISA schools with 12 or more sailors may enter both varsity and JV teams, however only the varsity team score will be used to determine the event's usable scores. A JV team from eligible schools may also be entered only when pre-approved by SAISA and the venue. JV teams will use the boat they bring and not rotate to other boats. All schools shall be members in good standing with SAISA.

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available upon check-in.

8. BOATS

Collegiate 420's will be used. 15 boats will be provided for varsity fleet by Ransom Everglades School. The first 15 varsity teams to register will have a boat provided. The remaining varsity teams must bring a competitive 420. Ransom Everglades will provide sails to all varsity teams bringing boats so the varsity fleet will have equal competitive sails. JV teams must bring a boat and sails to the regatta.

9. RACING AREA

The regatta will be held on Biscayne Bay, east of the Ransom Everglades campus.

10. LUNCHES

Plan to bring your own lunch. The use of disposable plastic water bottles is HIGHLY DISCOURAGED. Large Igloo containers of ice water will be available to all competitors, coaches, and spectators for refilling your re-usable canister.

11. DAMAGE

Damage that requires more than normal maintenance is considered a serious incident. If the Regatta Chairman determines that reasonable care was not used and resulted in damage one or both boats may be disqualified regardless of any alternative penalties already taken. In extreme cases, either or both boats (skipper & crew) may be excluded from the rest of the regatta and held financially responsible for the damages. Due to varied conditions that may be encountered, and the skill level of individual sailors and teams, it is the advisor &/or coaches' decision to sail and participate and their Decision to Race.

12. DIRECTIONS

Ransom Everglades Upper School is approximately 20 minutes from Miami International Airport and lies on the waterfront of Coconut Grove just South / Southwest of Dinner Key. Detailed directions to Ransom Everglades Upper School are available from the contacts below or at www.mapquest.com.

15. PFD

U.S. Coast Guard approved Type III lifejackets will be required for all competitors.

16. CONDUCT

No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, or distilled spirits, each as defined in Chapter 51 of the US Internal Revenue Code and intended for beverage use), or marijuana, cocaine, or any other controlled substance (as defined in 21 US Code 802), the possession of which, by that contestant is unlawful under 21 US Code 841. Infringements of this regulation and/or other inappropriate conduct occurring during this event, may be the basis for a hearing under RRS 69.1. The protest committee for such a hearing shall include a member of the ISSA Board of Directors &/or Regatta Chair, the Chief Umpire of the event, and at least one other person. This protest committee

shall, at a time and place selected by it, meet to hear said protest, and it may impose scoring penalties, or other sanctions that it deems appropriate, including summary removal from the regatta.

17. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participates in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority, host and Race Committee will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
