2018 New Orleans High School Spring Series Hosted by Southern Yacht Club

NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES:

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the ISSA Procedural Rules, the SEISA district rules, this Notice of Race, and the Sailing Instructions. In the event of a conflict between the governing documents and the Sailing Instructions the latter shall take precedence.
- 1.2. RRS Appendix P is in effect modified per ISSA Procedural Rule 14(c).

2. ELIGIBILITY:

- 2.1. Competing schools must be members of SEISA and meet ISSA eligibility rules as prescribed in the Procedural Rules.
- 2.2. Teams must be accompanied by a designated adult team leader, who may be an advisor, coach or parent recognized by the school.
- 2.3. Multiple teams from the same school are allowed.

3. ENTRY AND COMMUNICATIONS:

3.1. Eligible schools and sailors must enter by emailing Kevin Gunn at kgunn@uanola.org with their intent to participate.

4. ENTRY FEE:

4.1. No entry fee is required for this series.

5. BOATS

- 5.1. 420s will be provided by Southern Yacht Club. Boats will be sailed as provided.
- 5.2. There will be no rotation of boats of boats between races during the course of a single day; however, boats will be assigned to different boats each day.

6. Dates:

Day 1: February 23 Day 2: March 2 Day 3: March 16 Day 4: March 23 Day 5: April 20

7. Schedule:

- 7.1. The first race for each day will begin at 4:15. Racing will continue until three races are completed, 6:00 or sunset, whichever comes first.
- 7.2. A pizza dinner and trophy presentation will be given after racing on April 20th.

8. COURSES:

8.1. Races will be modified windward-leewards once or twice around as hailed by the race committee.

9. SCORING:

- 9.1. TechScore will be used for daily results
- 9.2. Only the highest placing boat from each team for each race will be scored to determine the overall winning team for the series.

10. COACHING:

10.1. While team leaders, chaperones, coaches, parents, advisors and other support personnel are encouraged go afloat in the sailing area, coaching is only allowed between races. A boat may not receive coaching between the three-minute warning signal and the finish of her race.

11. PRIZES:

- 11.1. A perpetual trophy will be awarded to the winning team of the series. The winning team is responsible for engraving the trophy with their school's name and the associated engraving fees.
- 11.2. Trophies will also be awarded to teams placing first, second, and third in the series.

12. OFFICIAL NOTICE:

12.1. No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, marijuana or any other controlled substance, as defined in 21 U.S. Code 802, the possession of which is unlawful under U.S. Code 841, or alcoholic beverages (distilled spirits, wine, and beer, each as defined in Chapter 51of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code and intended for beverage use). An alleged breach of this procedural rule shall not be grounds for a protest. However, when a report is received from any source, alleging such a breach a protest committee consisting of the regatta chairperson, a member of the ISSA Board of Directors, and the chairperson of the protest committee, shall follow the process described in RRS 69.1(b). If a hearing under RRS 69 is held, a competitor found to have breached this procedural rule shall be excluded from the remaining races of the series and, where practical, be removed from the regatta venues and sent home. Additional penalties consistent with RRS 69.2 may be imposed on the competitor or the competitor's team. This regulation is in effect during the entire event from the date and time of arrival through the date and time of departure from the regatta site.

13. RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS:

13.1. By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the Organizing Authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

14. WAIVER OF LIABILITY:

- 14.1. Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race.
- 14.2. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
